#### Welcome

This morning we welcomed Eve into Kestrel Class. Kestrels (and Mrs Seymour) have done an excellent job helping her to settle into her new class.

#### **Building Update**

Our new classroom building work remains on track for completion at the end of half term. In order to meet this deadline there will be a continued increase in the number of trades on site. We anticipate this is going to have an increased pressure on available parking over the rest of this week and would encourage you to use the parking offered in the wider area, such as Charlie's car park.

Following the conclusion of the modular build, work will then move on to redeveloping some internal areas of school. A lot of this work will be taking place during the half term break to ensure the least disruption to school as is possible. This will also ensure that the increased number of trades on site will reduce significantly once the children return after the half term break.

## Reading

As much as we do all that we can during the hours your children are with us, they are only with us for a fraction of time; what happens outside of these hours is entirely driven by you. A relatively easy way to make a huge difference to your child's learning is through reading, both reading to your child so that they experience a rich vocabulary of language and also daily practise of their own reading books.





The table below shows you just how much difference you can make in a year.

Time spent reading	Total minutes per year	Total hours per year	Hours across Primary
10mins per night on school days	1900	32	224
10mins per night everyday	3650	60	420
30mins per night on school days	5700	95	665
30mins per night everyday	10950	182.5	1277.5
English lessons (1hr per day)	11400	190	1330

By reading 10mins per night just on school days, your child/ren will have spent an additional 224hrs reading across their entire time in primary school. If you can find 10mins every single day, this total increases to 420hrs of learning gained 420hrs from just 10mins per day.
