See note below (red) from last year’s report to explain strategy.</p> <p>To support children in future years, swimming lessons have been arranged with the local private school for all of Years 3 and 4 from June 2018 onwards</p> <p>Due to Covid and maintaining class bubbles we have not been able to access our current Year 6 have not been able to access swimming facilities (local private school)</p> <p>Year 3 and 4 had the first half of their 10 sessions in the summer term. Of the Year 4s, 100% could swim 25m by the end of the 5 weeks.</p>
