Medicines in School – Lip Balm

With the particularly cold weather we have had recently, we have had an increase in requests for children to bring in lip balms. We have sought further guidance on this this morning to ensure we have the latest available advice. Lip balm is classed as a medication and therefore falls under our managing medicines policy. If it has been prescribed by a doctor and is required to be used greater than 3x per day then we can support with this. If this is not the case, children are not permitted to bring them into school.

In addition to applying Lip Balm before coming to school, the NHS also recommends: 1) cover your lips with a scarf when you're outside in cold weather 2) drink plenty of water to avoid becoming dehydrated.

Should the above guidance change, we will of course inform you.
