Reading

- Every day the children read something although it may not be with an adult.
- School reading books changed once a week
- Library book to share – changed once a week
- Everybody Read
 - – Friday after half term tbc
 - any family member welcome



Maths

- Every day the children will take part in an aspect of maths.
- Mastering Number - NCETM
- Skills are taught and then assessed away from the direct teaching. This will determine if they are able to apply the skill.
- Using mathematical language to explain their thinking is really important – STEM sentences – missing parts children fill in using their own words.



Writing



- Every day the children write something
- Daily SoundsWrite phonics – apart from Thursday
- Skills are taught through units of learning e.g story writing, writing for interest, factual writing
- Grammatical aspect very important – nouns(people, places, objects eg girl, city, orange) verbs(action words eg sing, run), adjectives(describing words eg rough, smooth), conjunctions(words that link phrase/short sentences together eg and, so, but) punctuation, handwriting



Homework



- Handwriting/spellings – Year 1 – words children want to learn – high frequency words (see sheet)
- Reading – little and often – consistency is key
- Numbots/TTRockstars
- If they want to create/write at home bring in to show at school.
- Play games – snakes and ladders, connect 4, I spy..., One day I went shopping...
- Explore the park/garden – what have you found?
- Practical Maths – cooking, weighing, patterns in the environment, paying for items at the shop
- Websites - Phonics play, Cool Maths games, BBC bitesize KS1
