### **Building Work Updates**

Our building work is complete... for now.

PHBeck finished all of the work on Friday and we are now in the process of setting up the room for use. I can also finally reveal what the old Buzzard classroom has become. With the new storage space being created in the hall, it has meant that we were able to knock through the old storage cupboard in the classroom and enlarge it into one large room. It now means that Kestrels, Sparrowhawks and (old) Buzzards rooms are all of a similar floor space. New Buzzards is a little larger which still affords us the flexibility of rooms should we have a 'bulge year' at any point in the future.

Therefore, the next stage will be to move the classes through, with Sparrowhawks moving into the redesigned classroom over the next half term. Once Sparrowhawks have vacated their room, we are planning to work with the Diocese to redevelop their old classroom as we move towards becoming one of the first three carbon net-zero schools across the Diocese. Our reliance on oil to heat the school will be removed as we move to air-source heat pumps. As part of this work we are also bidding for solar panels which will negate the additional electricity costs for the pumps. We are also upgrading certain windows to improve insulation – Sparrowhawks current classroom and the link room between Sparrowhawks and Kestrels are two of the areas that will benefit from these upgrades. Once the windows are replaced, we can then move forward with updating the fixtures and fittings in the rooms. The plan is for Kestrels to move into the redecorated room which will allow Little Owls to move into the current Kestrel Classroom. The link room between them will become an Early Years/Key Stage 1 library and intervention space.

All of the above will then provide us with a much-needed intervention/meeting room in the current Little Owls room. This will be easily accessed without disturbing others thanks to the new corridor in the art/DT space.

I do appreciate that the above is hard to visualise without being on the site, but I can assure you it is







going to make a huge difference to our teaching spaces and the teaching team are very excited about moving into the new locations. Whilst I would love to move forward with this immediately, we are in the position of needing to wait to see just how much the Diocese can support with funding as part of the decarbonisation work. Whilst this may slow progress a little, the more we are financially supported with, the more we can look to improve other areas of the school.

#### **Funding**

Hopefully, you will all have read the letter from our chair of governors referring to voluntary contributions. This is particularly pertinent with the Diocese trying to support us with our decarbonisation aims. If all goes to plan, the Diocese will be providing circa £300k towards the work. As a Voluntary Aided School, there is a required governor contribution of 10% towards these works. Fortunately, the Diocese have successfully accessed funds that mean the full 10% will not be required for all of these works. The total cost of the contribution will be unknown until the full extent of solar panels and window replacements are known – we are currently being advised that it will be between £5k and £9k required.

To be clear, a governor contribution is not a contribution by the governors themselves, they are simply responsible for finding the funding. In most Voluntary Aided Schools this is raised through voluntary contributions by parents. It could also be achieved through donations from local businesses. If you are in any way able to help us achieve our contribution figure, or know of a business who could help us to do so – please let us know. For more information about governor funds, see here

The car park remains inaccessible until the skip and fencing items are removed later this week. As soon as this is done the 'closed' sign will be removed. I am hoping this will be the case by Wednesday morning.

We have received complaints from neighbours who have reported their driveways being blocked. Please park considerately, both for our neighbours and other road users.

This morning was our last drop off via the learning garden. At the end of today the children will be collected from the playground. Tomorrow morning the children will return to their usual access point through the main gates. Please note, the gates now open outwards so please ensure space is left for them.
