Alongside this we are working closely with Durrington Research School to further improve the quality of our curriculum – this year the focus work with Durrington is looking at Geography, Science and English. Whilst a lot of the training for both of these key areas has been facilitated through in-house cover, there will be times over the rest of this year where this is not possible and you will see additional teachers in class.
