amphibians	Animals such as frogs and toads that can live both on land and in water.
birds	An animal with feathers and wings. Female birds lay eggs. Most birds can fly.
carnivore	An animal that eats meat.
fish	A creature that lives in water and has a tail and fins. There are many different kinds of fish.
hearing	The sense which makes it possible for a person or animal to be aware of sounds.
herbivore	An animal that only eats plants.
mammals	Mammals give birth to babies rather than laying eggs, and feed their young with milk.
omnivore	An animal that eats both plants and meat.
reptiles	Cold-blooded animals which have skins covered with small hard plates called scales and lay eggs.
sight	The ability to see things using our eyes.
smell	The ability that your nose has to detect things.
taste	To know the flavour of something in your mouth
touch	The ability to tell what something is like when you feel it with your hands.

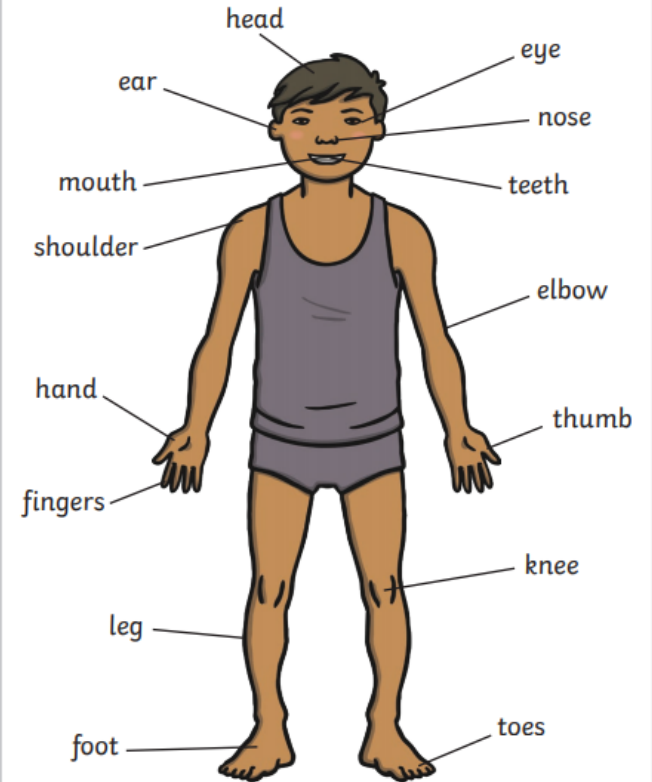
